First Bar Olympics a Huge Success

On February 24th, the Peoria Jaycees held their first annual Bar Olympics at the Recovery Room. Twenty people competed in four events- 9-ball pool, shuffleboard, 301 darts, and Golden Tee Golf. The results for each competitor were ranked with the best score receiving 20 points and the worst scoring 1. These scores were then totaled to determine the overall winner. The event got off to an inauspicious start as Brad Gordon showed up with his golf clubs and brought along a caddy. Evidently, Matt King, project chairman, was not explicit enough in his description of the event and just said six holes of golf. Brad was not very happy when he learned that we were only playing a video game. "I spent over \$400 on this new driver and I was looking forward to trying it out. Tim Sheets of the Peoria Jaycees recently filed a lawsuit against a corporation that sells time reporting software for cybersquatting. TSheets, Inc. of Boise, Idaho recently established a web presence with the domain name of www.tsheets.com. to market their web-based time tracking software for small and medium sized businesses. This rubbed Tim the wrong way as he was in the process of obtaining tsheet.com to use for his burgeoning photography business. "Everyone knows me as tsheets", said Tim. "My e-mail address is tsheets, my blog is tsheets. Heck, I even had business cards printed with tsheets.com on them from ScreenGraphics in anticipation of receiving tsheets.com as a domain name." Tim has retained Jaycee Lawyer Extraordinary, Steve West, to represent him in his lawsuit against TSheets, Inc. It will be several months before the case can be heard due to the unavailability of Mr. West because of other Jaycee legal matters. Asked why he didn't just use the domain name www.timsheets.com, Mr. Sheets had this to say, "Huh, I never thought of that. Nevertheless, I want to make them pay."

Do You Know.... the History of NASCAR

In the south, bootleggers souped up cars to transport illegal moonshine. Eventually, these bootleggers started racing these cars on Saturday on tracks that sprang up around the South. These events were of varying standards with inconsistent rules and unsafe conditions. In 1949, Bill France started what is now known as NASCAR. Flag 101- History of the United States Flag

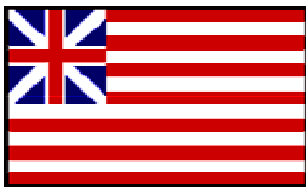
The U.S. flag has undergone many changes since the first official flag of 1777. On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress passed the first flag act, which said that the flag would be made of thirteen alternating red and white stripes and thirteen stars on a blue field. The flag has changed a total of 26 times over the past 231 years. At the beginning there were not strict rules on the order of stars nor the proportions of the flag. For a while, the flag even had 15 stars and 15 stripes. The act of April 4, 1818 provided for 13 stripes and 1 star for each state, to be added to the flag on the 4th of July following the admission of each new state. The 13 stripes represent the original 13 colonies. On June 24, 1912 President Taft signed an Executive Order that established the proportions of the flag and provided arrangements of the stars in six horizontal rows of eight each, a single point of each star to be upward. Later Executive orders staggered the stars horizontally and vertically. The current flag has been around since July 4, 1960 when Hawaii became the 50th state in 1959. The current flag has nine rows of stars staggered horizontally and eleven rows of stars staggered vertically.

Do the flag colors represent anything? The flag's colors did not have meaning at the beginning, but they became significant for the Great Seal of 1782.

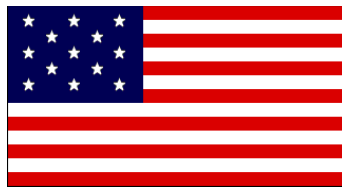
White: Signifies purity and innocence
 Red: Hardiness and Valor
 Blue: Vigilance, perseverance, and justice

What are the significance of the stars and stripes? Stars are considered a symbol of the heavens and the divine goal to man has aspired from time immemorial: the stripe is symbolic of the rays emanating from the sun.

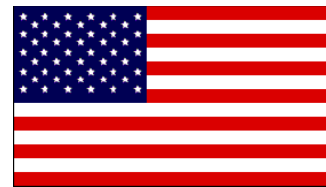

The flag is the symbol of our national unity, our national endeavor, our national aspiration.

The flag tells of the struggle for independence, of union preserved, of liberty and union one and inseparable, of the sacrifices of brave men and women to whom the ideals and honor of this nation have been dearer than life.

It means America first; it means an undivided allegiance.

It means America united, strong and efficient, equal to her tasks.

It means that you cannot be saved by the valor and devotion of your ancestors, that to each generation comes its patriotic duty; and that upon your willingness to sacrifice and endure as those before you have sacrificed and endured rests the national hope.

It speaks of equal rights, of the inspiration of free institutions exemplified and vindicated, of liberty under law intelligently conceived and impartially administered. There is not a thread in it but scorns self-indulgence, weakness, and rapacity.

It is eloquent of our community interests, outweighing all divergencies of opinion, and of our common destiny.

As we “swing” into spring, ID is starting to warm up too! I am sure everyone is getting ready for **St. Patrick’s Day** so here are some fun facts about all things Irish!

- Ireland, also known as the Emerald Isle, receives around 90 inches of rain a year.
- There are 4 places in the United States named Shamrock, the floral emblem of Ireland. Mount Gay-Shamrock, W.Va., and Shamrock, TX, were the most populous, with 2,623 and 1,841 residents, respectively. Shamrock Lakes, Ind., had 162 residents and Shamrock, OK, 125. (Statistic for Mount Gay-Shamrock is from Census 2000; the other statistics in the paragraph are 2005 estimates.)
- There are 9 places in the United States that share the name of Ireland's capital, Dublin. Since Census 2000, Dublin, CA, has surpassed Dublin, OH, as the most populous of these places (39,328 compared with 34,964, respectively, as of July 1, 2005).
- If you are still not into the spirit of St. Paddy's Day after stopping by one of the places named "Shamrock" or "Dublin", then you might consider paying a visit to Emerald Isle, NC, with 3,686 residents.
- About 41.6 billion pounds and 2.4 billion pounds of U.S. beef and cabbage, respectively, were sold in 2005. Corned beef and cabbage is a traditional St. Patrick's Day dish. The corned beef celebrants dine on may very well have originated in Texas, which produced 7.3 billion pounds worth of beef, while the cabbage most likely came from California, which produced 466 million pounds worth, or New York (456 million pounds).
- Americans annually consume 21.6 gallons of beer per capita. On St. Patrick's Day, you may be able to order green-dyed beer at one of the nation's 47,984 drinking places, some of which may be Irish pubs.
- St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, is one of Christianity's most widely known figures. But for all his celebrity, his life remains somewhat of a mystery. Many of the stories traditionally associated with St. Patrick, including the famous account of his banishing all the snakes from Ireland, are false, the products of hundreds of years of exaggerated storytelling.

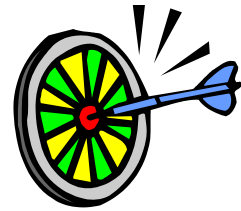
